Hopefully you have by now purchased your tickets to the November 4th Temple Gala at the Poughkeepsie Tennis Club. This very special evening includes:

The evening begins at 5:00pm with sparkling wine and hors d'oeuvres and time for socializing and bidding at the silent auction. Guests will then be invited to take their seats in the dining room (with a glass of sparkly and some yummies) for the presentation of this year's honorees.

The theme for this year's Gala is Social Action and is based on Tikkun Olam, a concept of kindness performed to perfect or repair the world. This Jewish value is often used when discussing issues of social policy affecting those who may be at a disadvantage.

We will honor various Vassar Temple committees and projects devoted to social action. We are also honoring two congregants who are involved in endeavors outside of the Temple organization. Andrea Ciminello (with the Vassar Temple Refugee Leadership Team) has been a committed volunteer with the Mid-Hudson Refugee Solidarity Alliance, and Ron Rosen, who has been a champion of conservation and the environment, especially through his roles with the Appalachian Trail Conservancy.

Following the honoree ceremony, there will be a delicious buffet dinner with wine and then an hour of dancing and the opportunity for silent auction bidding.

The Gala is an important event for Vassar Temple. It is the Temple's largest fundraiser, representing a considerable portion of our budget, a very special social and ceremonial event at which we acknowledge the efforts of the congregation to improve our community. And it will be a fun time!

The great rabbinic sage Hillel taught "Do not separate yourself from the community" (Pirkei Avot 2:5). During this month, we, as the Vassar Temple community, have at least two meaningful

opportunities to fulfill this essential Jewish obligation.

On November 4th, thanks to the very hard work of a team led by Arnie Serotsky, we will celebrate Vassar Temple at its annual gala. Our theme this year is one that is central to the mission of Vassar Temple: tikkun olam, the Jewish mandate to participate in acts of social justice to help repair our broken world. Whether it is the annual donation of school supplies for the Morse school, numerous programs to feed the hungry in our community and beyond such as the Yom Kippur Food drive, the Crop Walk, LunchBox and Trim a Thanksgiving, or Mitzvah Day, social justice is at the heart of Vassar Temple.

This year we have selected two honorees, Andi Ciminello and Ron Rosen, for their outstanding commitment to tikkun olam within our congregation as well as in the larger Mid-Hudson Valley: Andi, for her efforts to care for the stranger through the Mid-Hudson Refugee Solidarity Alliance and Ron for his devotion to protecting our environment,

especially through his leadership roles in the Appalachian Trail Conservancy. We look forward to strong attendance both to celebrate the work of our honorees and to support Vassar Temple. If you are unable to be present physically at the gala, you can certainly make your presence known through various ways to contribute. Your on-going financial support enables Vassar Temple to play a leading role in the community in our efforts for tikkun olam, and, of course to fulfill our three-fold mission as a synagogue to be a Beit Tefillah (House of Prayer), a *Beit Midrash* (House of Study) and Beit K'nesset (a House of Community).

The month of November is also the time when we can fulfill our communal responsibility as American citizens by exercising our right and privilege to vote. This, too, is an act of *tikkun olam* for voting is one of our most powerful means of making our voices heard. This is a significant voting year in the Mid-Hudson Valley on local, state and national levels. While Jews can proudly claim a very strong voting record (studies show Jewish voter turnout averages around 85% in contrast to just 50% for the country overall), turnout is generally much lower in non-presidential years. Please be sure to include voting in your schedule for Tuesday, Nov. 6th. If you need a ride, please call Marge Groten at 845-380-7074 or Arthur Groten at 845-380-1374.

If you have a young person in your family who is eligible to vote, please encourage them to do so. According to estimates, only 50% of registered young voters actually voted in the 2016 presidential election. It's never too soon for our young people to take on their civic responsibilities..."Do not separate yourself from the community!"

In another teaching in Pirkei Avot, Rabbi Chaninah taught "pray for the welfare of the government." (Pirkei Avot 3:2). Thus, a prayer for the government has become a regular part of Shabbat and Holy Day morning worship. As we approach Election Day, I close with some the words of the prayer for our country in Mishkan T'filah:

O Guardian of life and liberty, may our nation always merit Your protection ... Grant our leaders wisdom and forbearance. May they govern with justice and compassion ... May our homes be safe from affliction and strife. and our country be sound in body and spirit.

Don't use SCRIP yet? Never have? This is a great time to start!



HEROES AMONG US: Where She Belongs

Sometimes the most inspiring heroes are in our midst and we don't even know it – or them. As I was looking for the subject of this month's article, the answer walked through my front door. Indeed, this afternoon, Temple member, Gail D'Alessio, whom I must admit I had not yet had a chance to get to know, stopped by to borrow some of my folding chairs. After talking to her for just a few minutes, I knew I had found my subject!

Gail is one of the newer additions to our congregation, though she has known many members for years. Growing up in a nonreligious Italian family in a Jewish Bronx neighborhood, Gail always identified with the Jews around her. She warmly recounts Friday afternoons when she would stand on the corner with friends waiting for the neighborhood Rabbi to pass by en route to synagogue so that they could say, "Good Shabbos!" Not long after Rabbi Berkowitz arrived at Vassar Temple, Gail decided to convert to Judaism. She joined the Temple in 2016, completed her conversion the following year, and since that time has become a regular participant in Torah Study, joined the Ritual Committee, organized the 2018 Shabbaton for Anita Diamant, served on the Search Committee that hired Rabbi Altman, became a 5th grade teacher in our Religious School, and agreed to organize the upcoming "Golden Gelt Raffle."
