From the Rabbi's Desk



I write these words in the shadow of the Poway synagogue shooting as we prepare to commemorate Yom HaShoah. An interfaith prayer service will take place immediately before that program to enable our community to come together *“to pray for a better, safer and more compassionate community, nation and world.”*

The words of Rabbi Nachman of Bratzlav have been echoing in my ears since I heard the awful news. *“The whole world is but a narrow bridge; the most important thing is not to be afraid.”* Despite all the horrors that our people have endured, Jews have been driven by hope and not by fear. Fear keeps us in a defensive position, with a tendency to close off and turn within; hope will motivate us to join with those who share our vision for the world, to act with wisdom and caution, but to look forward with eyes open towards possibilities and growth.

I took strength from the inspiring words of the rabbi of Chabad in Poway, Rabbi Yisrael Goldstein, who, himself was injured in the attack: *“I pray that my missing finger serves as a constant reminder to me. A reminder that every single human being*

is created in the image of God; a reminder that I am part of a people that has survived the worst destruction and will always endure; a reminder that my ancestors gave their lives so that I can live in freedom in America; and a reminder, most of all, to never, ever, not ever be afraid to be Jewish.”

Our best response to attacks on Jews is to live proudly as Jews. In a few days we will have the opportunity do just that with the observance of the Festival of Shavuot when we celebrate the very essence of Judaism -- the revelation of Torah. Seven weeks after Passover we recreate the moment when our ancestors stood at Sinai, accepted the Ten Commandments and entered into a covenant with God to be a ‘kingdom of priests and a holy people.’ Each year as we celebrate this festival, we stand again at Sinai and recommit ourselves to our faith and our people.

One of the great innovations of Reform Judaism was the ceremony of Confirmation in which our young adults affirm their commitment to Judaism. Appropriately, this ceremony was assigned to the Festival of Shavuot, with its Torah reading of the Ten Commandments and Haftarah reading from the Book of Ruth, the poignant story of a Moabite who, through her relationship with her mother-in-law, chooses to cast her lot with the Jewish people.

Shavuot begins Saturday evening, June 8th, and we will observe the practice initiated by the medieval Kabbalists of a Tikkun Leil

Shavuot, an evening of learning in anticipation of the moment of revelation (though unlike the Kabbalists, we will NOT stay up all night!). We will join with Temple Beth-El for a program of informal learning and celebration with the traditional dairy desserts of the holiday. (See article, p.5 for more information).

On Sunday, June 9th, we will hold our Shavuot Confirmation Service, beginning at 10:00 am., during which time we will recognize three young people, Mariel Kelson, Sam Kelson and Jordan Russo, who have demonstrated their commitment to their faith by fulfilling the requirements of becoming Confirmands. Can there be a better expression of hope for our future than this?

I will celebrate Shavuot this year with a renewed sense of pride in and commitment to Judaism and the Jewish people. I hope that you will join me as we stand proudly once again at Sinai, and in doing so, echo the words proclaimed so profoundly by Rabbi Goldstein, ‘Am Yisrael Chai,’ the people Israel lives.
