From the Rabbi's Desk



Each morning of Elul (the last month of the year), Jews traditionally sound the shofar, its call beckoning us to take note and prepare for the days of judgment that will soon be

upon us. The *Yamim Noraim* (Days of Awe) are a time for *heshbon hanefesh* (an accounting of the soul): serious, sometimes painful self-reflection as we judge our actions over the past year: Of what are we proud? Where did we miss the mark? Where and how can we improve? As our liturgy for the Holy Days will remind us, simply by being human we will make mistakes: *we have gone astray, we have sinned; we have transgressed.* It is the brilliance of Jewish tradition that we have the opportunity to begin each year anew, with a clean slate, if we just do our best to do *teshuvah*, (literally: to return) by atoning for past mistakes, asking forgiveness of those whom we have wronged, and committing to try to do better in the future.

Even as we reflect on our actions over the past year, the *Yamim Noraim* do not dwell on the past; they encourage us to look ahead and plan for the year that will soon begin anew. They remind us that while there is much that will happen to us that is not in our control, we can take responsibility for that which is in our control, most especially our response to the events around us. The haunting *Unetanatokef* prayer reminds us that *Repentance, prayer and acts of justice temper judgment's severe decree.*

We are accountable for our words and our deeds. The eleventh century Jewish philosopher Bahya Ibn Pakuda taught: "Days are scrolls: write on them only what you want remembered." This then is the message of these Days of Awe: strive to be your best self; be thoughtful and deliberate in word and deed; admit mistakes; give time and attention to relationships; ask forgiveness of those whom you have wronged and be open to those who seek forgiveness from you; do something to help heal our broken world; make a positive contribution to the Jewish people.

Heshbon Hanefesh is, indeed, a daunting task. The good thing is that we do not undertake this journey alone; we are accompanied by the Vassar Temple community and we join with the entire Jewish people. Even as each of us undergoes our own personal preparation for

Rosh Hashanah, we will join in collective preparation that is the tradition of *Selichot* (see article on p.6) I hope you will join us for the Arnold Award presentation and *Selichot* program followed by the moving service with its taste of the beautiful holy day liturgy.

I look forward to welcoming Cantor Goldmann to the bema for the *Yamim Noraim* and to the beauty and grace that her song will add to our worship, uplifting our spirits and raising up our prayer. If you weren't able to join us in August when she was here, you will have the opportunity to meet her before Rosh Hashanah for Shabbat services on September 13th and then for *Selichot*.

L'shanah Tovah Tikateivu – may you and your loved ones be written for blessing in the New Year. May it be a sweet year for our Vassar Temple family!

His volunteer resume includes Bulletin publishing (done more recently by his wife, Marianne), Trusteeship during which he served at various times as Board Secretary, Treasurer, Religious School Committee Chair, 1st Vice President and President,

Founder's Award 2019

The following is the text from the June 2019 Founder's Award presentation:

"It is my honor to introduce the person that the Vassar Temple's Board of Trustees has selected for this year's Founder's Award. Through this award we honor an individual who has given exceptional service to Vassar Temple and been a model who inspires others to help sustain our beloved Temple.

Judy Rosenfeld has been a blessing to Vassar Temple for decades. Judy Ann grew up in Kingston NY, but she found her way to Vassar Temple together with her husband Eric. Behind every great woman there is a great man.

Judy and Eric's search for a Hebrew school for their son, Adam, led them to Vassar Temple; but it was their love for Vassar Temple and friends that kept them here. After Adam and their daughter, Lisa, completed their bar and bat mitzvahs and confirmations and set off as adults, at a point when many parents drift away from a temple, Judy and Eric stayed active in the Jewish community as members of Vassar Temple. Barux hashem!

It couldn't be more fitting that Judy is this year's recipient. Judy's humble, kind and compassionate heart served our temple as the chair of our Reyut Committee for several years. Reyut mean's friendship and Vassar Temple's Reyut Committee plays a crucial role in caring for our members. One way is our annual L'dor V'dor (Generations) Shabbat to honor 40+ year members, which only last week

Judy was still busy doing.

Judy has provided a great service to our Temple as President of the Vassar Temple Sisterhood. With Sisterhood, care often means addressing the tangible needs of our temple. Our temple is grateful for Judy's leadership role in maintaining and refurbishing the kitchen for so long.

It's what Judy has done with our kitchen that is so beautiful and important to our temple. It wouldn't be Purim at Vassar Temple without so many members and their children coming together to bake hamantaschen, an activity that Judy has organized here for over 10 years. Together our Temple produces over 1,200 hamantaschen to deliver to homes and college students, so our temple can bring the feeling of the holiday and the love of Vassar Temple to them.
