#### Take action against hate.

Jewish Women International provides individuals with a concrete means of responding to the rise in hate speech and violence in which Jews have been targeted. Please read this call to action from JWI:

Tens of thousands of people marched against **Hate and Fear.** The rise of white supremacy and anti-Semitism is an undeniable threat to the safety of our communities, and we must stand together in solidarity. There is legislation, at the local and federal levels, that can help stem the tide of hate crimes. The <u>NO HATE Act</u> and the <u>Domestic Terrorism Prevention Act</u> would improve hate crime reporting, expand resources to victims of hate crimes, and require federal law enforcement to regularly assess threats and provide training to local law enforcement. Call your <u>Senators and</u> Representative and urge them to co-sponsor these two bills!

JWI affiliation is not necessary in order to participate. It's no longer enough to chant "never again"; take action to ensure that "never again' is more than simply a slogan.

The Dutchess County Interfaith Council has taken action on the moral imperative of caring for our earth by entering into a partnership with Nexamp Community Solar.

Council members can subscribe to a share of a local solar farm and receive credits on their utility bills for the energy produced.

The Vassar Temple Board of Trustees is proud to be the first DCIC member congregation to enroll. We'll receive a discount on our electricity, support renewable energy, and demonstrate environmental leadership in the community. DCIC will receive a donation from Nexamp as a result. This decision reflects the URJ's 2017 resolution encouraging congregations to work with community interfaith partners to implement climate change solutions.

Congregants also have the opportunity to sign up for residential community solar with Nexamp. For each household that participates, Nexamp will make donations to both Vassar Temple and the DCIC. If you have been wondering how to "go solar" without installing rooftop panels, or if this is not feasible on your home, this is an ideal option. There is no cost to join, no equipment installed on your home, no long-term commitment,

guaranteed savings, and no cancellation fee.
