From the Rabbi's Desk



Under the best of circumstances, writing a bulletin column that will feel relevant when it is read a month later is a challenge. Writing on April 1, 2020 for the May 2020 bulletin is unusually challenging. Our world is changing so fast and there are so many unknowns, so I fear that anything I write will be irrelevant thirty days from now.

An article in today's (April 1) *New York Times* about the impact of the coronavirus in New York reminded me of just how dramatically life has changed since March 1:

--Thirty-one days after the region recorded its first case ... the number of confirmed cases of the virus will shoot past 100,000 when today's figures are released.

--Deaths attributable to the virus, which have been climbing by an average of 30 percent each day for the past week, stood at 1,866 in the region on Tuesday night ... and are set to pass 2,000 today.

The month began with cautions about large gatherings, then transitioned to New York State on "pause;" social distancing has entered our lexicon and we sign off on calls and emails with

"stay safe and healthy." CDC guidelines change continually as they learn more about COVID-19 each day; first we are told not to wear masks to save them for the sick and then the possibility emerges that everyone should wear masks because significant numbers of people with COVID-19 don't exhibit symptoms at all.

It is simply impossible to predict what our lives will be like when you read this bulletin. I would like to think that by May 1 we will have begun to take baby steps towards resuming normal lives, but I don't think we will be there yet. I do hope and pray that New York will have passed the apex, that the incidents of the virus and the deaths will have begun to diminish. Even as I pray for that, I know that other states will only be climbing towards that apex and that our country will be far from safe. I hope and pray that enough masks, ventilators and testing kits will have been manufactured and distributed under federal authority so that they will get to the places where they are most needed. I hope and pray that the checks from the relief package will have reached households that are so desperately in need of funds, that unemployment payments will be sent out and that Congress will have passed additional aid packages.

As I write this column, our beloved congregation has thus far been spared from this disease. I pray with all my heart that this continues and that our friends and loved ones

are also safe. Even as the numbers of cases of COVID-19 in Dutchess County have remained relatively low thus far, it is hard to imagine that we could escape unscathed either from the illness itself or from its aftermath. There will be tremendous economic challenges ahead for all of us.

The one thing I do know for certain is that we, Vassar Temple, will be there for another – whether or not we can be in close physical proximity. We will support and comfort one another, we will find strength through prayer and our community, we will find ways to help those in need, and we will manage through this crisis and the difficult times ahead -- together.

I look out my windows and see the crocuses blooming, the daffodils about to burst forth. Spring is in the air; with spring, comes hope for a brighter tomorrow. May I not face the same dilemma writing for the June Bulletin. Stay safe and healthy.

mendations, livestream became the silver lining when we all really needed it most.

We have also been doing meetings via Zoom. The format works great and we did learn a lot about the importance of making the meetings secure. We also learned that facilitating these meetings becomes much easier after everyone learns more about using it. The Temple does have its own account and all meetings will be conducted this way until we get past this terrible virus.

Someday we will get past this, and our world will slowly come back, though it will not be what it used to be, my hope is that we will be even more compassionate and understanding of the human condition.

Help with Civic Engagement and Social Action!

The Vassar Temple Social Action Committee has a new name: the Vassar Temple Social Justice Committee. It is active on many fronts, and we can take on almost anything new--our only limit is people power--so please let us know your suggestions!

Our committee has two arms to help manage all the projects. The Civic Engagement arm is led by Howard Susser, and deals with advocating for social justice issues and legislation on the local, state and national levels. One area of civic engagement we're currently involved in is refugee and immigrants' rights, and activities relating to this issue are overseen by Perla Kaufman. The second arm of the committee is led by Marian Schwartz, and is mostly engaged in meeting the social and economic justice needs of the local community. Under this arm, we have special projects, in addition to these on-going ones: service to the homeless coordinated by Judy Harkavy, monthly participation at Lunch Box (our local "soup kitchen») coordinated by Paul Ciminello, and Can Jam (our ongoing food collection for area pantries) coordinated by Joel Kelson & family. We also collect funds for many worthwhile causes in the Temple *tzedakah* boxes. Suggestions for recipients always welcome!

In addition to our Temple committee work, we are affiliated with the Jewish Social Action Coalition, a network of local synagogues and Jewish clubs. Ron Rosen and Perla are our representatives to the Coalition (more are welcome!), and one of the primary beneficiaries of the Coalition's good works is Morse Elementary School, where there is always a need for tutors and library aides.
