Shards: Putting the Pieces Together

A one-man show with Cantor Evan Kent

Live from Jerusalem!

Saturday, December 12th @ 4:00 pm

Cantor Kent will transport us from the streets of Jerusalem to the villages of Eastern Europe to the suburbs of Long Island in the 1960s, sharing stores of his grandparents' immigration to the United States at the beginning of the 20th century interwoven with his own tales of his Aliyah (immigration to Israel) just a few years ago. "Shards" takes us on a poignant, often humorous journey that spans continents, decades, and generations.



The theatrical adventure includes 1 actor, 21 characters, 3 puppets, 4 generations, and 8 songs adding up to 1 unforgettable theatrical adventure. Ultimately "Shards" is the story of finding home, finding homeland, and along the way learning a bit more about yourself. At the end of the performance, Cantor Kent will talk to the zoom audience- giving us all a greater sense of connection. This will be followed by Havdalah and lighting Hanukkah lights together in our homes.




The Mensch on a Bench wants to be in a home this year with a family of Vassar Temple. \$20


