It is traditional on the Festival of Shavuot, which celebrates the revelation of Torah at Mt. Sinai, to read the Book of Ruth. The book tells the beautiful and touching story of Ruth, a Moabite, who, after the death of her husband, accompanies her mother-in-law, Naomi, back to the land of Judah and commits her life to Naomi and Judaism. Ruth becomes the model of one who chooses Judaism. Today, whether born a Jew or choosing Judaism as an adult, we are all "Jews by Choice" and we have all been on different journeys into our Jewish lives.

Our Tikkun Leyl Shavuot program this year will explore our different journeys. Rabbis Altman, Polish, and Victor will open the Tikkun (learning session) with teachings about the Book of Ruth. Then a member from each congregation, including Melissa Wall of Vassar Temple, will speak about their "Journey into Jewish life." For the final part of the program, we will all have the chance to reflect on our own personal journey and share in small groups.
