MAKE A DIFFERENCE ON VOTING RIGHTS, **Sunday, August 1, 8:30 - 9:30 pm**

Please join us in representing our congregation at a RAC-NY Zoom meeting with Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer to talk about two key bills to protect voting rights: The [For The People Act \(S.1\)](#) is a broad voting rights bill and the [John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act \(S.4\)](#) addresses racial discrimination in voting. Our Reform Movement strongly supports passage of both bills as important steps towards racial justice in this country. This Zoom meeting will take place on Sunday, August 1, 8:30 - 9:30 pm. Rabbi Rick Jacobs, president of the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ) and Rabbi Jonah Pesner, Senior VP of the URJ and Director of the RAC will be speaking. meeting with Senator Schumer, the more impact we will have. There is an even split in the Senate between the pro- and anti-voting forces. The more people we have on the webinar, the stronger message we send to Senator Schumer that he must do everything in his power to make sure the freedom to vote is protected and these two voting rights bills pass. Book Club to Discuss “The Assignment” on August 18

Vassar Temple’s Sisterhood Book Club will discuss “The Assignment,” by Liza Wiemer. Inspired by a real-life incident, “The Assignment” explores discrimination and antisemitism from the perspective of high school students. Seniors Logan March and Cade Crawford are instructed by a favorite teacher to argue for the final solution - the Nazi plan for the genocide of the Jewish people. Logan and Cade decide to take a stand, and soon their actions draw the attention of the student body, the administration, and the community at large. How do you defend the indefensible? But not everyone feels as Logan and Cade do, and it’s not long before the situation explodes, and acrimony and anger prevail. Showcasing the power of student activism “The Assignment” is available in paperback, through Amazon, with copies available in the local library system. The meeting will take place through Zoom, on Wednesday, August 18, at 2:00 pm. As an exciting bonus, the author, Liza Wiemer, will be joining our discussion.
