LUNCH BOX UPDATE

This month, Vassar Temple and MHIA served over 170 meals. This is the largest number of meals that we have ever provided and it underscores the incredible need for free food services that our community is facing.

Please help us provide this monthly meal by:

Purchasing a can (or two or three) of beans and dropping it into the designated “Lunch Box” container on the kitchen counter. Every month we use 30 pounds of beans in our chili.

- Making a donation to the Temple’s Lunch Box fund so that we can purchase 30 pounds of ground turkey used in our chili. A \$10 donation helps buy 3 pounds of ground turkey which becomes 5 meals.
- Purchasing a pound (or two or three) of ground turkey and placing it on the designated “Lunch Box” shelf in the freezer at the Temple. Every month we use 30 pounds of chili.
- Volunteering to help serve or cook the meal. VT prepares and distributes this meal every first Sunday of every month (except July and August).

Book Club to Discuss “The Poisoner’s Handbook”

Vassar Temple Sisterhood's Book Club will discuss “The Poisoner’s Handbook” by Pulitzer Prize-winning author Deborah Blum. The book

has been described by critics as a fascinating Jazz Age tale of chemistry, detection, poison, and murder. In early 20th century New York, poisons offered an easy path to the perfect crime. The author explores how scientists Charles Norris and Alexander Gettler laid the foundation for the modern field of forensic science. They set the justice system on fire with their trailblazing scientific detective work, becoming the pioneers of forensic chemistry.

The “Poisoner’s Handbook,” equal parts true crime, twentieth-century history, and science thriller, is available in paperback through local book stores, as well as in various formats through the library system. The meeting will take place on Thursday, April 20, at 2:00pm. Betty Renner and Marian Schwartz will lead the discussion, to which everyone is welcome.
