

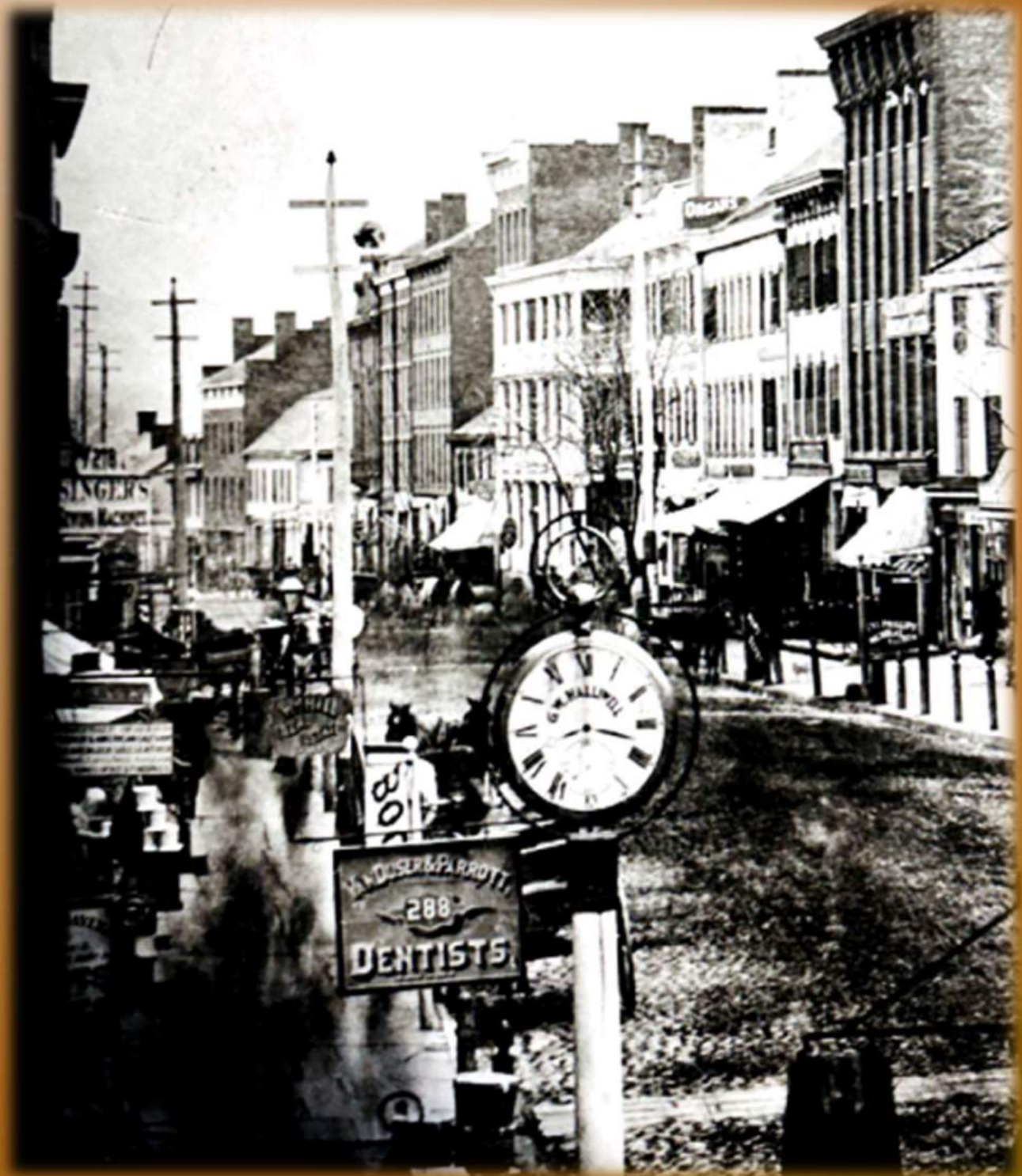





I am pleased to learn from your letter of March 28, 1973, that Vassar Temple will observe its 125th anniversary on June 2nd.



#### SISTERHOOD RUMMAGE SALE

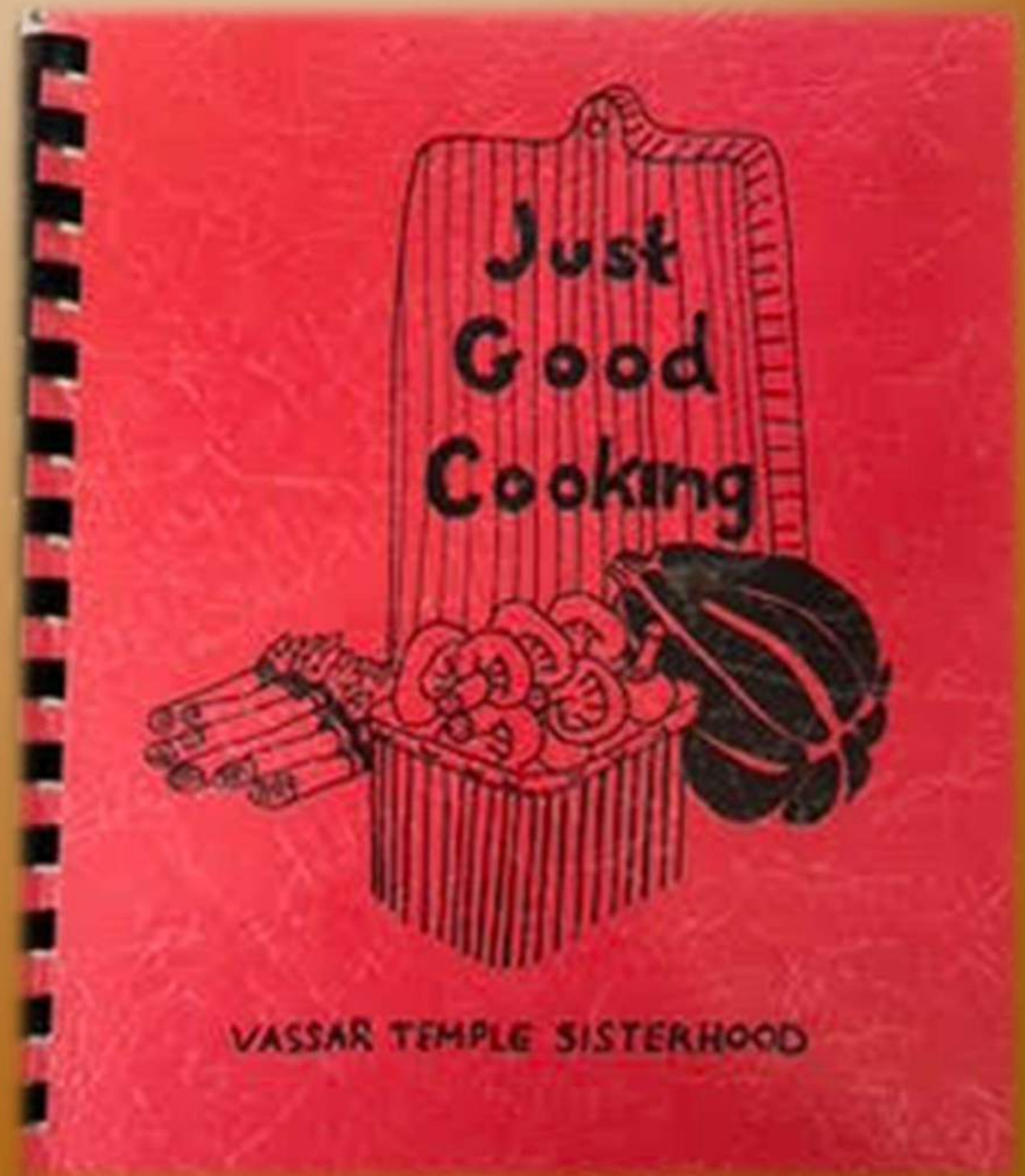
