Well he did what any one of us might have done as well. He carefully shook off the shoe and served the gravy with the rest of the meal. Furthermore he said, the most compliments received at the conclusion of the dinner was for the very flavorful gravy! I have been assured by the Grandview staff that the delicious food we are enjoying tonight has not been seasoned by any articles of clothing!
