



This Is Real: A High Holy Day Journey ~ with Rabbi Jeff Stombaugh



Join Rabbi Jeff Stombaugh for a deep, honest, and transformative exploration of Jewish time. While we often think of the High Holiday season as just the ten days between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, the journey actually begins in late July and flows through mid-October.

Using *This Is Real and You Are Completely Unprepared* by Rabbi Alan Lew as our guide, we'll travel from the emotional depths of Tisha B'Av to the spiritual heights of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, and then settle into the joy and rootedness of Sukkot — together.

This class will offer fresh perspectives on Judaism, the chance to cultivate spiritual practice, a sacred space for reflection, and practical insights for personal growth. It's also a meaningful opportunity to get to know Rabbi Jeff as he begins this new chapter at Vassar Temple.

Open to seekers, skeptics, and everyone in between. While reading the book is not required, the experience will be much richer if you do. Come as you are.

From the Rabbi's Desk: Pulling Up a Chair



When I was a sophomore in college, the plan I had for my life began to unravel. I didn't have a backup but I did have a question: Where could I bring my whole self — creatively, spiritually, and intellectually — into alignment and full expression?

The answer, surprisingly (though not to my mother!), turned out to be the rabbinate.

At the time, I had no clear vision of what it meant to be a “traditional” rabbi—or even what kind of rabbi I wanted to become. (For the record, I'm still listed in my wife Steph's phone as “Not Your Average Rabbi.”) But I had a sense—maybe even a faith—that Jewish life was wide enough to hold the complexity of who we

are. And that meant there was space for all of me, too.

I've come to believe there are as many ways to be a rabbi as there are to be Jewish. And that's one of the reasons I love this tradition so deeply—it's not *just* a religion, not *just* a culture, a heritage tradition or an international and ancient community. It's all of those things and more, layered and intertwined, alive and evolving.

What first drew me in was a yearning to explore and uncover the richness of those layers. What has kept me on this path toward Jewish leadership is the experience of witnessing what Jewish living can offer us individually, and what Jewish community can hold, support, and build with each other.

So here I am, pulling up a chair to Vassar Temple's long and beautiful table—a table that's been set and reset for 175 years. I'm honored to join the story of this community, and to co-author this next chapter with you. In just a short time, I've already heard from people across the country who carry Vassar Temple in their hearts. That alone is a reflection of how much this place matters.

As we begin our journey together, I want to invite you into a conversation:

- What brought you here, and what keeps you here?
- What questions stir and animate you?
- What dreams do you hold—for this community, and for the future of Jewish life in Poughkeepsie and beyond?

I'd love to hear it all—the old, the new, the quirky, the sacred.

I'm honored to serve as your rabbi. And I can't wait to see what we'll discover, create, and become—together.



VTS Book Club to Read *Code Name Hélène* by Ariel Lawhon

Wednesday, August 20 ~ 2pm



Based on a real-life story, *Code Name Hélène* is about a socialite spy and astonishing woman who was one of the most decorated women in WWII. In 1936, Nancy Wake, an intrepid Australian expat living in Paris, bluffs her way into a reporting job for Hearst newspaper and meets the wealthy French industrialist Henri Fiocca. Then the Germans invade France and she takes on a code name, Lucienne Carlier, enabling her to smuggle people and documents across the border. During the course of her spy career, she takes on several code names, including Helene, and becomes one of the most powerful leaders in the French Resistance, armed with a ferocious wit, her signature red lipstick, and the ability to summon weapons straight from the Allied Forces.

The Founders' Service Award is presented by the Board to a congregant who has provided strong long-term leadership in the operation of our Temple for the benefit of its members as well as for the welfare of our local community. This year's award was conferred upon Andi and Paul Ciminello. The Ciminellos have been Temple members for 38 years, and their children Lauren and Adam "grew up" in the Temple. Andi worked on Cradle Roll, then moved on to chair the Membership Committee several times, as well as serving on several Rabbi Search Committees, chairing our most recent one. She also spearheaded the work of the Refugee Resettlement Committee, working with a network of community groups to settle several immigrant families in the local area.

Paul serves on the Temple's House Committee and has coordinated major projects to make our building more energy efficient, including the installation of our new windows. He has served as coordinator of our Temple's Lunchbox program for the past eight years, helping to feed our hungry neighbors as well as cementing a partnership with the Mid-Hudson Islamic Association as our collaborators in the project. He is also our Temple's representative to the Dutchess County Interfaith Council. Paul has been a participant in Torah Study for many years, sometimes stepping up to lead the group when the Rabbi is away.

Andi and Paul go on to extend their Jewish values into the community. Andi serves on the curriculum committee for Vassar College Lifelong Learning, and they both volunteer for Dutchess Outreach, Planned Parenthood and Guiding Eyes for the Blind. Andi and Paul Ciminello truly exemplify the qualities of a Founders' Service Award winner, and they serve as inspiring role models for us all.

SISTERHOOD RECIPE OF THE MONTH: Submitted by Polly Lewis

Corn & Green Bean Salad: a cool tasty salad for warm summer days

Ingredients

- 4 to 8 fresh ears of corn
- 1 pound green/yellow beans
- 3 tablespoons cider vinegar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1/3 cup finely chopped red onion
- 2 tablespoons snipped fresh parley



Instructions

- Remove husks and silks from corn and cook in a covered 4 quart Dutch oven with enough boiling salted water to cover, for 5 to 7 minutes or until tender; drain.
- When cooled enough, cut kernels from cobs (should yield about 4 cups of corn kernels).
- Meanwhile, in a covered medium saucepan, cook beans in a small amount of boiling salted water for 3 to 5 minutes or until crisp-tender; drain.
- In a large bowl, combine cider vinegar, salt and pepper; whisk in oil. Add corn, beans, onion and parsley.
- Cover and chill for up to 4 hours.
